

# Vaccination



**As of this date, Revolution topical and Seresto Collar are the only flea controls we feel comfortable recommending for your Oregon Bordoodle. No flea control is without risk but these have consistently been the safest. We DO NOT recommend Hartz, Bravecto, Nexgard, Simparica, Trifexis, Comfortis or any other flea collar besides Seresto.**

## **Did you know?**

It doesn't take multiple "booster" vaccinations for a puppy to gain immunity from a specific disease? It only takes one properly timed vaccine. Veterinarians give multiple vaccines of the same disease not because it takes several to have immunity but because every dog is different as to when they are receptive and able to properly absorb and create antibodies for that disease. Studies have proven that for most puppies, this is between 11 -18 weeks of age but can be much sooner and even later.

## **Is he protected?**

Unless you plan on performing titer testing to determine your puppy's immunity, you won't know for absolute certain if your puppy is protected. But by following our Vaccination protocol as outlined in your **Medical care form**, your puppy has a very high chance of being protected either because he has rejected the vaccine and still has Mother's antibodies, or he absorbed the vaccine properly and as antibodies from it. We developed our Vaccine timing protocol with our Veterinarian, taking into consideration all of the newest research and Puppy Culture's views.

## **Combining Vaccinations:**

Evidence shows that overloading your puppy with too many vaccinations at one time increases the risk of complications. Aside from Distemper, Adenovirus and Parvovirus (which we give together) all other vaccines are spaced out at least 7 days from one another to allow proper absorption and a less taxed immune system.
